The major cults will be examined with reference to the central themes of Christian doctrine.



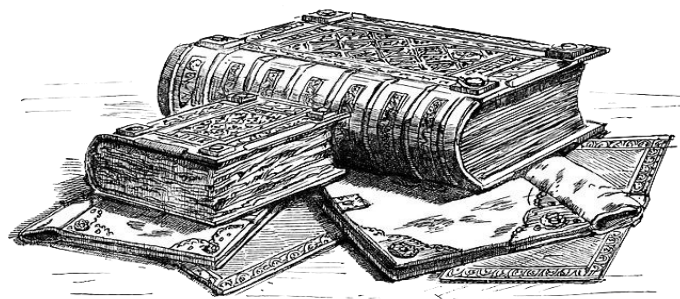

PAYMENT SCHEDULE

Students who pay the full amount of tuition at the time of registration will receive a \$2.00 per credit hour discount. ❖

PROGRAMS OF STUDY

Diploma in Bible and Theology

English Bible/Divinity Course

The purpose of this program is to prepare the student for the local church pastorate, the mission field, or some aspect of vocational Christian service. Students will examine all the major areas of theological training. A total of 94 credit hours are required for graduation. The Divinity Course Curriculum includes:

The English Bible Course includes all of the above courses, but instead of Greek Course, Electives are taken to equal the 15 credit hours.

- ❖ Homiletics is taken by men only; Ladies will take a 2 credit hour Christian Education elective.
- ❖❖ This is an oral examination of all candidates for the Diploma. This is a pass or fail course. A passing grade is required for graduation. No credit is given.

CHRISTIAN SERVICE

Heritage recognizes God's purpose for the local church and requires students to be involved in serving the Lord through a local church ministry. these ministries can include Sunday School teaching, youth work, music ministries, visitation ministries, home Bible classes, tract distribution, nursing home ministries, and preaching. Diploma students are responsible for securing a ministry with the approval of the Administration and under the authority of the local church. Regular Christian Service Reports are required.

Christian Service ministries earn credits towards graduation requirements. One credit hour can be earned per year. One credit hour is required in the Certificate in Christian Ministries Program. Four credit hours are required in the Diploma Program, (one per year). Christian ministry for credit must be approved by the Administration.

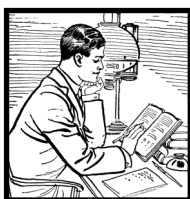
ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

PROGRAMS OF STUDY

Certificate in Christian Leadership

This course of study is for the new Christian or those desiring to develop their grasp of basic Bible Truths. It will provide a foundation for all theological studies. Twelve (12) credit hours are required for graduation. The curriculum includes:

Certificate in Christian Ministries

The purpose of this program is to provide the student with a working knowledge of the entire local church program. It is designed to prepare lay individuals for active service in the local church. STUDENT LIFE

Christian Standard

Students are to govern their conduct on the basis of Scriptural principles with a willing and cooperative spirit. It is expected that their lives will demonstrate a clear and consistent Christian testimony in daily living.

Certificate and Diploma students have an obligation to dress appropriately and to avoid extremes in fashion. Standards are regulated by the Administration. Women are to wear mid-knee length dresses and skirts, or dress slacks. Men are to wear dress clothes, collar shirts. Class and chapel attendance are required. Personal emergencies and sickness are excusable absences.

Attendance and Christian service in a church of like precious faith are required for Certificate and Diploma students. Heritage seeks to be supportive of the local church and local church ministries.

Employment

Classes are scheduled for Monday and Tuesday evenings from 6:30-8:30 PM. Students should reserve the hours from 6:00 p.m. on for class and study requirements.

We recognize that students will need employment. Work schedules should not interfere with class schedules and attendance, nor should a Diploma student obligate himself excessively to an employer.

Housing

Housing is the responsibility of the student under the supervision of the Administration. The Institute will assist in the locating of housing for those students making a request. In certain instances housing must be approved by the Administration.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

1. We believe that the Holy Bible as originally written was verbally inspired and the product of Spirit controlled men, and therefore has truth without any admixture of error for its matter. 2 Tim. 3:16.
2. We believe there is one living and true God, an infinite, intelligent Spirit; that He is one in being and essence, possessed of three personal distinctions revealed to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Ex. 20:2, 3; Matt. 28:19; John 10:30.
3. We believe in the personality of Satan, that he is the unholy god of this age, and the author of all powers of darkness. 2 Cor. 4:4; Eph. 6:11, 12.
4. We believe that man was created in innocence but by voluntary transgression fell from his sinless and happy state, in consequence of which all mankind are now sinners. Rom. 5:12, 19.
5. We believe that Jesus Christ was begotten of the Holy Spirit in a miraculous manner; born of Mary, a virgin, as no other man was ever born or can ever be born of woman, and that He is both the Son of God, and God the Son. Luke 1:35; Matt. 1:18, 20.
6. We believe that in order to be saved, sinners must be born again. (John 3:3-8); that the new birth is a new creation in Christ Jesus (2 Cor. 5:17); that in the new birth the one dead in trespasses and sins is made partaker of the divine nature and receives eternal life, the free gift of God (Eph. 2:1-10). All Those who are sanctified in Christ Jesus have been individually chosen of God unto salvation before the foundation of the world. Eph. 1:3-14; 2 Thess. 2:13.
7. We believe God's sovereign purpose in evangelism disallows the use of gimmicks and carnal promotional methods and other means which do not rely upon the convicting ministry of the Holy Spirit, but that it requires the evangelization of the lost, inviting them to trust in Christ for salvation. John 16:7-13.
8. We believe that a local church is a congregation of immersed believers, associated by covenant of faith and fellowship of the Gospel: observing the ordinances of Christ; governed by His laws, and exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word. Eph. 1:22, 23; 2:14-22.
9. We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper are the Scriptural ordinances of the Church. 1 Cor. 11:23-28; John 1:33; Matt. 28:18-20.
10. We believe that the personal, visible and pre-tribulational return of Christ is imminent, followed by the Tribulation, the Second Coming of Christ to the earth and the Millennial Reign of Christ, and that the eternal state of the unsaved is punishment, while the saved inherit eternal life and blessing. John 14:3; Rev. 20:11-15, 1 Thess. 4:13-18.
11. We believe that Biblical separation from modernism, new evangelicalism, and the charismatic movement is imperative for God's people. Titus 1:10, 13; 3:10, 11; 2 Tim. 2:16; 2 Tim. 4:2-5.

ADMISSION INFORMATION

Heritage is dedicated to training men and women who are called to serve God. We require that applicants be Christians of approved character and committed to a life of serving Christ. Admissions into the Diploma Program requires formal application.

1. Evidence of having been born again and living a consistent Christian life as indicated by personal testimony and their Pastor's recommendation.
2. A high school diploma or its equivalent. God's call supersedes the requirements of men. Therefore desirable students of maturity will be accepted.
3. Reasonably good health.
4. Agreement to be guided by the doctrinal position and standards of the school as set forth in this catalog.

The Institute admits students of any race, color national and ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded, or made available to the students at the school.

ADMISSIONS PROCEDURE FOR:

Diploma Program

1. Write to the Institute and secure the necessary forms.
2. Have forms completed by the appropriate individuals and returned to the Institute.
3. Complete application forms, write out your personal testimony, if married include wife's statement of agreement and personal testimony, send a snapshot of yourself and a \$20.00 application fee and mail to the Institute.
4. Request official transcripts from high school or college and mail them to the Institute.

Certificate Programs

This does not require a formal application. The student should pre-register at least 6 days before the start of a new Trimester and register on the first night of classes. (A late registration fee of \$10.00 will be applied on or after the first night of classes.)

TRANSFER STUDENTS

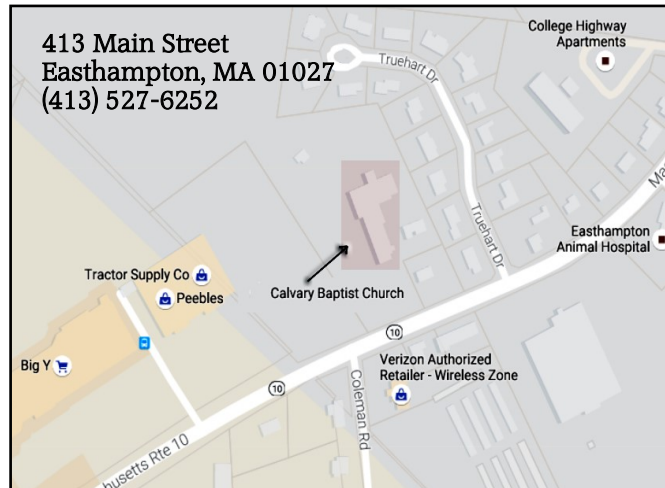
Students who have attended other institutions of higher learning must request transcripts and catalogs to be forwarded to Heritage for evaluation. Credits will be allowed where courses correspond with those taken at Heritage. Transfer students must complete at least 22 Credit Hours including 9 Credit Hours in Systematic Theology and 6 Credit Hours in Bible in not less than three trimesters at Heritage to qualify for the Diploma in Bible and Theology. Transfer credits are subject to qualifying examination.

WITHDRAWAL REFUNDS

A full refund may be obtained before the second week of classes. After the second week of classes, no refund will be given.

A student who withdraws at the request of the school will receive no refund. No application fee is refundable.

Take exit 17B-Easthampton, Rt. 141. Take Rt. 141 over Mt. Tom into Easthampton Center to Rt. 10. Take a left at the light onto Rt. 10 and follow to the Easthampton-Southampton town line, Calvary is on the right just before the Big Y Shopping plaza.

COMING FROM EAST OR WEST ON MASS. TURNPIKE:
